## **Early Years**

- 1492: Christopher Columbus sails for India
- 1608: Thomas Pell (1608 1669), 1st Lord of Pelham Manor, born
- 1611: Dr. John Pell (1611 1685), father of John 2<sup>nd</sup> Lord of Pelham Manor, born
- 1620: Mayflower lands
- 1626: Dutch buy island of Manhattan
- 1635: Thomas Pell arrives in new world
- 1654: Thomas Pell bought 9166 acres constituting Pelham from Wampage I; eventually to amass 200,000 acres or 500 sq miles according to one source

- 1664: British expel Dutch from New Amsterdam
- 1669: John Pell becomes 2<sup>nd</sup> Lord of Pelham Manor (1643 1719). Dr. John Pell was son of Reverend John Pell, and a nephew of Thomas Pell.
- 1670: Dr. John Pell arrives in New World
- 1671: Boston Post Road established
- 1683: Incorporation of Westchester County



- 1719: Upon death of Dr. John Pell, Thomas Pell II (1675 –
   1752) become 3<sup>rd</sup> Lord of the Manor with 60,000 acres
- 1752: Upon death of Thomas Pell II, oldest son Joseph's oldest son Joseph becomes 4<sup>th</sup> Lord of Manor. Each male child gains 10,000 acres apiece for Joseph, John, Thomas, Joshua, Philip (17xy 1751), & Caleb.
- **1732:** Philip Pell II, son of Philip, born (1732 1788)

Note:

1735: For context, John Adams (1735 – 1826) born

1757: Philip Pell II built Pelhamdale at age 25
1760: Colonel David Pell (1760 – 1823), son of Philip Pell II, born. Will inherit Pelhamdale
1775: April 19<sup>th</sup>, "Shot heard round the world" in Lexington
1776: Declaration of Independence



- 1776: Battle at Pell's Point (10/18/76): Howe's war map shows Pelhamdale: 240 years exactly one month from today!
- 1776: Pelham in Lower Westchester buffer zone during Revolutionary War.
- 1788: David Pell assumes ownership of Pelhamdale upon death of Philip Pell II.
- 1789: George Washington becomes President
- 1790: Population of Pelham is 199
- 1790: David Pell married Hester Sneden: eventually, 10 kids

- 1797: John Adams becomes President
- 1800: Thomas Jefferson defeats John Adams
- 1823: Colonel David Pell dies
- 1823: James Hay buys house upon death of David Pell & names it "Pelham Dale"
- 1825: Significant settlement in Pelhamville
- 1826: Adams and Jefferson die on July 4<sup>th</sup>
