The National Museum of Mathematics (MoMath on Fifth) Seeks Proposals of Math-Related Art for Installation in its new "Composite Gallery on Fifth"

(NEW YORK, NY – April 22, 2024) - The National Museum of Mathematics (MoMath), currently located at 225 Fifth Avenue, seeks proposals of math-related art for installation in its gallery "*Composite on Fifth*."

The selected exhibits will be visible through a large, plate glass window located directly along the popular tourist corridor that stretches between the landmark Empire State Building and the iconic Flatiron Building, offering an unparalleled opportunity for the artwork to be viewed by crowds from around the world.

"We look forward to showcasing artists whose work exemplifies the interconnections between mathematics and art, and to bringing the wonder and beauty of mathematics to new and different audiences through imaginative and engaging exhibitions," said Executive Director and CEO Cindy Lawrence.

Selected exhibits will be on view from November through January 2024; February through May 2024; summer 2024; and fall 2025.

The acclaimed art exhibit, "*Mathemalchemy*," will be on view in the Composite Gallery on Fifth from May 22 to October 27, 2024.

The National Museum of Mathematics (MoMath) is North America's premier cultural institution devoted to the wonders of mathematics and its many connections to the world around us. Transformed temporarily into a pop-up museum called *MoMath on Fifth*, located at 225 Fifth Avenue on the corner of 26th Street and Fifth Avenue, the Museum is open seven days a week, from 10 am to 5 pm. MoMath is expected to open at its new permanent location early in 2026.

MoMath will continue to host both in-person and online programming throughout this time and expects to announce its new permanent location soon.

MoMath on Fifth contains new exhibits including *Sea Saw* and *Done in a Million* as well as popular favorites such as the *Square-Wheeled Trike* and *Math Square*, and the Museum continues to welcome guests of all ages, including families, school groups, young adults, seniors, and visitors from around the country and the world. In-person programming, including talks, birthday parties, events, and field trips, are also offered at *MoMath on Fifth*.

Since March 2020, MoMath has presented almost 6,000 online events reaching more than 170,000 people from all fifty states in the U.S. and 128 other countries around the world.
